

# Types of Pronouns

pronoun: takes the place of a noun or another pronoun

Type of Pronoun	Definition	Examples
Personal Pronouns	Refer to specific people or things	I, you, he, she, it, we, they
Demonstrative Pronouns	Point our specific people or things	that, this, these, those
Interrogative Pronouns	Used to ask questions	who, whom, whose, which, what
Possessive Pronouns	Show ownership or possession	mine, yours, his, hers, its, ours, theirs
Reflexive Pronouns	Reflect or refer back to the subject of a sentence	myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, ourselves, themselves, yourselves
Intensive Pronouns	Emphasize a noun or pronoun in a sentence	myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, ourselves, themselves, yourselves
Relative Pronouns	Introduce relative clauses and connect them to the noun they modify	who, whom, whose, which, that
Indefinite Pronouns	Refer to nonspecific people or things	all, both, many, none, few, some, anyone, several, nobody
